And you, the audience, are the vital ingredient to making this a success for these artists. Your participation in the unique talkback with the artists provides the insight they need to move their work forward.

In the past 22 years, Emerging Artists has premiered over 400 new works and also garnered a Drama Desk Nomination, received the American Theatre Wing Grant Award for Consistent Commitment to Excellence in Theatre, and named Best Off-Off Broadway Theatre Company in NYC for Actors to Work With by Backstage Magazine. In the last five years alone, Emerging Artists has provided opportunities for over 2,000 diverse artists to see their work developed and premiered at no cost to the artists to submit or participate.

Their tempestuous relationship intensifies until John reveals an event in his past that he cannot make peace with. Carol also has something in her past that helps bridge a gap in understanding between them. Or is it something more that brings them together? Do miracles happen at Christmas? (A staged reading of a new play.)

Singer-actress-writer Deborah Karpel mixes autobiographical characters and events with imaginary stand-ins, evoking a family that felt rootless and accidental without a unifying identity (although the world outside might have characterized it as “lower-middle-class lefty Jews from Queens”). The story follows her mother’s unlikely upbringing as a Jewish girl in coal mining Appalachia, VA, her parents meeting at a Catskills socialist summer resort, growing up in the 1970’s, and twists of fate that lead Deborah to the music of her grandfather. THE MIDWOOD MIRACLE features original compositions along with traditional Americana, western swing, operatic arias, art songs, and Yiddish songs.
